

## **Minutes from Meeting 4/21/11**

The meeting was called to order by Dave at 7:03. April minutes were read and approved by the members.

The Treasurer's report was given. We have \$680 in reserve.

The Webmaster reminded the members that we could have on-line access to the Summerville Journal Scene by going on line to request it.

The Secretary reported she had met a man who lives on Greenhurst St. and he is a landscaper. He agreed to mow in the sign area about 1X a month. His name is Don Smith Ph. 560-8849. The President and Secretary spent a morning trimming the trees and high weeds behind the Greenhurst sign. The sign area was decorated with bunnies for Easter. I will put up flags for Memorial Day.

The President's report indicated that the Town had responded to her request for road patch. March 14th: Left corner of Carmen and Greenhurst, Terry & Braly, Larson Dr. and Dootsie Ct. Beatrice and Bailey were not done, possibly because these roads need greater work than just a patch. Rita noted that the quality of the patches was poor and already coming out.

### **Old business:**

We discussed the recent article on the suggestion that Dorchester Co. might buy Pine Trace. Our concerns continue to be the issue of heavier traffic on Miles road which is quite congested at busy times of the day. We would prefer a green barrier be left to screen the property from the road.

No movement noted on the proposal to put a liquor store in next to the Sunshine Store/gas station.

### **New business:**

The Crimewatch signs on Greenhurst were yanked out and thrown in a ditch. The signs were recovered unharmed.

We should have a speaker from the Vet's club from MRBC in May.

Captain Decker gave the group a rundown on the community events. County Pow-wow in Ridgeville, new classes at the Police Academy in the fall, a reserve class for Reserve officers and Shady Grove May 21st.

He reviewed the recent news article which identified 5 persons involved in the shooting and drug activity on Roberts Dr. April 18th. He said it was quickly reported by a resident, and the Sheriff himself detained the four men who left the scene.

He reviewed the other incidents in the sub-division. These were mostly confined to the rental property areas and included CDV, trespassing, burglary, theft of motor vehicle, DUI, and breaking & entering.

Members were reminded of the date of the next meeting: May 19th. There were 10 members present.
