

Minutes from the March 15th meeting

1. Treasurer's report: we have \$755 in our account- \$41
2. Secretary's report: Marina will fill out National Night Out registration and mail it in.

5. Guest Speakers:
 - Our first guest speaker Margie Page from Victims Advocate office in Dorchester County spoke about Domestic Violence and advised caution in laypersons getting involved if person doesn't want help. They are available 24/7 for emergencies. by call from the Sheriffs Office. We will discuss some special activity for October, Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
 - Mr. Chinnis spoke about the plans for a new jail and that the plan was not yet a done deal.
 - Jay Byar spoke next about progress on the Pine Trace plans and about the Ashley River Park which will likely be open before Pine Trace. They displayed the plans and talked about the improved recreational opportunities that are coming. The park will have a picnic shelter, walking trails, a kitchen and possibly some boating opportunities.
 - Senator Mike Rose spoke to the group about how the infrastructure Bank works and his position on impact fees for developers. He reminded the group that Election Day is June 12 and he and Sheriff Knight will be running for re-election.
