

MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 18th,2018

The meeting was called to order by our Webmaster. The minutes were reviewed and a motion was made to accept them as printed. This motion was seconded.

Lt. Barnhill began his report by telling us the crime in our neighborhood had dropped recently. There were only three reports.

Lt. Barnhill reminded us that the holiday season is just around the corner and thieves will be looking in car windows and homes for purchases and gifts to steal. Also be cautious about putting boxes out for trash which indicate you have electronics. Cut up boxes and tie them with black side out. If you will be out of town, call Sheriff's office to request Residence watch.

The Treasurer was not available but reported we had \$470 and we added \$8 to that.

The President had no problems to report.

Webmaster reported that residents are still using our website to look up information and complain about issues such as cars speeding through the neighborhood.

Secretary reported there are fall wreaths up on our center area, and flowers are still blooming.

Further discussion about the home at 206 Terry. Neighbors report frequent visits by officers and ambulances continue. There is an on-site manager but no information was given.

New Business:

Dorchester Co. work crews have been observed cleaning ditches and we are grateful that we had no flooding recently.
