

Minutes from March 17, 2022 Crime Watch Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 1902. Accepted February minutes. One correction: Insured golf carts are legal to use in the subdivisions.

LT Andy Martin, DCSD, attended and updated us on current crime stats in our community:

- There was an uptick of reports/calls from Greenhurst for 9 Jan – 16 Mar.
- There were 10 reports during this period.
- There were 994 patrols in Greenhurst with 7.4 patrols per shift. Patrols averaged 26 minutes.
- There was one motor vehicle theft and three thefts from a motor vehicle.
- Reports were made from these streets: Braly, Cobb, Dootsie, Lisa, Roberta, Susan, Terry, Bailey, Carmon, Greenhurst Ave.
- Discussed the Shalom house on Terry
- The homeless situation is not getting any better. Housing is priced too high. Average rent for a 1-bedroom apartment is now \$1400.

Treasurer report: Our current funds have increased to \$500.

Secretary report: Our secretary will be unable to attend meetings and publish the minutes presently. We are looking for volunteers who will attend and publish minutes.

8. Pine Trace Park is being built near the roundabout. Expect start mid-summer.
